

What applicants see when applying for SLC loan (undergraduate and postgraduate)

Once they login, when making a new application, they are presented with two choices:

Apply for student finance

Further education : Advanced Learner Loans

You're going to be studying for:

- a programme of GCE A levels and/or AS Levels
- a QAA Access to HE Diploma
- a further education Certificate, Diploma and vocational qualifications at levels 3 - 6
- any of the following BTEC Professional awards: a Subsidiary Diploma, 90 Credit Diploma, Diploma, or Extended Diploma
- an NVQ, level 3-6

When selecting a Higher Education link they see two further choices- undergraduate or postgraduate:

Undergraduate

You're going to be studying for:

- a degree, for example: a BA, BSc, teacher training
- a foundation degree
- an HNC or HND
- a certificate or diploma in higher education
- an Integrated Master's
- Postgraduate Initial Teacher Training eg Postgraduate Certificate in Education (PGCE)
- a Scottish postgraduate or Scottish Master's

When choosing an undergraduate loan:



Applicants will be asked to search for a university. When searching for Cambridge, multiple options will be presented as all our Colleges are set up as separate 'universities' on the SLC database. Those applying for a loan for an undergraduate, PGCE or MPhil in Architecture and Urban Design studies always have to choose one of the options starting with the College name (e.g. 'Darwin College – University of Cambridge'), not the 'University of Cambridge' option, which is used at the moment for Postgraduate Loans only:

Here is what happens if applicants select the 'University of Cambridge' option when applying for an undergraduate loan.

On the next page they will be asked to enter name of their course or UCAS number for the course. Let's say someone is applying for a BA in Music. When searching just under 'University of Cambridge' they will get a message saying 'no course found' as no undergraduate courses are setup under this option:
