## **SERMON THEME: TRANSFORMATION**

#### CHORAL EVENSONG: ALL SUNDAYS IN FULL TERM At 5:30 PM (UNLESS OTHERWISE STATED)

Evensong in English dates back to the time of the Reformation, but many elements draw on the ancient monastic 'offices' or 'hours' (regular prayers at certain times of day), especially to the office of vespers (evening prayer). The 1662 Book of Common Prayer provides the form of words and ceremonies that the Church of England uses to this day, although the service first appeared in this form in 1549. Congregations are drawn to the rhythms of prayer that have sustained worshippers down the centuries. Evensong at Girton is 'choral', meaning that key elements of the service are sung to beautiful choral settings by our College Choir.

Choral evensong also includes a sermon of around 10 - 15 minutes. Sermons often follow a theme for the term, allowing for in depth exploration of certain issues and topics from many different angles. In addition to the Chaplain, sermons are often given by notable guests preachers who bring valuable perspectives from their own life and context.

Our sermons at evensong this term explore the theme of Transformation.

#### CHARITY FOR LENT TERM WINTER COMFORT



Wintercomfort is a support hub, creating opportunities all year round for homeless individuals.

They offer information, advice, training and support in Cambridge for those who are homeless or vulnerably housed. Open daily throughout the year, they encourage and empower their service users to overcome disadvantage and to make positive, long term changes to improve their lives.

Today, the charity is the only day-time service in the city, providing year-round advice and support for an average of 750 homeless or vulnerably housed people each year. Over the past three decades Wintercomfort has continued to grow and adapt to meet the needs of the homeless community. All their work is Service User led, with 35% of their staff having accessed Wintercomfort's services in the past and 49% of the team having lived experience of homelessness.

Donations are possible by cash or by card, after Chapel services or at other points by arrangement with the Chaplain.
